## PROMOTING PARENT INVOLVEMENT

## Parents can involve themselves with the Title I program:

- 1. Developing the Parent Compact.
- 2. Read all communication and newsletters sent home from the Title I Program.
- 3. Attending open house and parent teacher conferences on a regular basis.
- 4. Cooperating with suggestions given for your child's academic success:
  - a. Positive reinforcement to build motivation
  - b. Setting goals.
  - c. Listening to your child read nightly.
  - d. Reinforcing study skills.
  - e. Developing responsibility.
  - Checking homework for quality work.
  - g. Review spelling words and sight words sent home.
  - h. Work on letters and sounds in appropriate grades.
  - i. Sign the Parent Compact.
- 5. Attending Title I Night
- 6. Provide for a quiet place for your child to read at home.
- 7. Ask questions for comprehension using Questioning Sheet sent home.

## Title I Teacher promotes Parent Involvement:

- Send home a monthly newsletter informing parents of skills they can reinforce at home.
- 2. Purchase and send home ABC cards for letter identification.
- 3. Send home printing paper for manuscript practice.
- 4. Send home work completed throughout the week for parents to review.
- Compile a list of Questioning techniques for Non-Fiction and Fiction Text for parents.
- 6. Send home board games to reinforce skills in their area of difficulty.
- Plan Title I Night.
- 8. Host a Spring Picnic for students to conclude the year of learning.
- Work cooperatively with teachers to ensure parents stay informed as to their child's progress.
- 10. Send home Title 1 Report at the end of each nine week period. Includes academic and behavioral information.
